ake Heart is a kinetic sculpture with a vibrant red color that will stand out almost anywhere. It is fully powder coated and thus extremely weather resistant. The heart spins in the wind about its vertical axis in an irregular and unpredictable way that is fun to watch. Two large and one smaller bicycle wheel provide the desired heart shape. Aluminum disks affixed to the spokes accentuate the heart outline. The heart sits atop a sturdy cylindrical pedestal. The top edge of this column feature's bicycle chain rings that add levity and spice to the sculpture. Three cassettes welded onto the cylinder where the water connections used to be have the same effect.
